TEST RUN TO RESUME IN-PERSON-WORSHIP

On Sunday, August 9th, we will have a test run of in-person worship with all the appropriate procedures in place to make the experience as safe as possible. Fifty people (including staff & volunteers) may gather in the sanctuary, and another 50 people may watch the service live-streamed in Hatfield Hall. Worship will continue to be available online to watch from home. Specific procedures can be found on the website, in the Agape from Afar newsletter, and in a church-wide email that will go out next week.
